
PTA NOTICEBOARD



Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

Gospel: Mark 10:46-52

Jesus was leaving a town called Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd was following him. A blind man called Bartimaeus asked Jesus for healing, and Jesus agreed because he could see that Bartimaeus had faith.



Bartimaeus was able to see again and he followed Jesus along the road. How do you think Bartimaeus must have felt to be able to see again?

Sometimes we all try to ignore things that we see, or we pretend that we haven't seen them. Can you think of a time you did that?

Perhaps you pretended not to see when someone was being mean to someone else in the playground. Perhaps you pretended not to see the homeless person asking for money? Perhaps you pretended not to see when someone dropped something in front of you and needed help to pick it up again?

Why do you think that we sometimes pretend not to see things?

Sometimes we know that what we have seen isn't fair or isn't right, but we don't know what to do about it. It can be easier to pretend that we haven't seen the problem than to work out what to do to make it better.

We can tell others and help them to see that there is a problem, but also that there are solutions to help make the world a fairer place.
