




### May - The Month of the Rosary:

## Parking on Cross Lane outside School:

A number of concerns have been raised with school regarding parents parking dangerously when bringing pupils to school and collecting them.

It is very important that the double yellow lines and yellow zig zag lines on Cross Lane are not used for parking in order to keep everyone safe.

The school is in regular contact with the road safety team at Sandwell Council to request visits from parking enforcement officers. If any parents would like to report a concern about parking directly to Sandwell Council, including any 'near misses' where accidents have been narrowly avoided, the contact number is 0121 569 4330.



I have recently received this information from Sandwell Council:

'There has been a total of 48 visits made by foot patrol Civil Enforcement Officers, with 25 observations made (to Cross Lane in the past two years). This has resulted in a total of 6 penalty charge notices being issued. In addition to this, the CCTV vehicle has also made regular visits during this two-year period, resulting in a further 8 penalty charge notices being issued.

The funding made available for road safety measures is targeted in areas where road traffic collisions are occurring which result in casualties. A three-year injury collision analysis has been undertaken for Cross Lane, and there have been no recorded injury collisions, during this period

It is for this reason, there are currently no plans to implement road safety measures along Cross Lane, during this financial year.'

Please remember that parents are kindly allowed to use the Holy Name parish centre car park when dropping off and collecting at the start and end of the school day.

Sunday 8.30am and 10.30am




# The Most Holy Trinity (Year B)

Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20

In this Sunday's gospel, sometime after his death and resurrection Jesus appears to the disciples. He has a very special task for them. What does he ask them to do?

Jesus asks them to spread his word – to teach people to follow his commandments. Can you remember what these commandments are?



Jesus asks us to love God and to love our neighbour as ourselves. Can you think of a time when you have shown love for a neighbour?

Jesus's words today were not just for his disciples – they were for all of us who follow him.

St Francis of Assisi said, "preach the gospel at all times, and when necessary use words." What do you think this means?

So what do you think the best way of sharing Jesus's word with other people is? Is it telling them about Jesus? Or do you think it might be better to show people through our actions?

What do you think we might do? We could be kind and generous and share with others. We could make sure that we always treat others the way we would want to be treated. We could try to make sure that the world is a fairer place for all people to live in.

Can you think of anything else that we do to show we believe in Jesus?

At the end of the reading, Jesus says, "I am with you always, yes to the end of time."

How does it make you feel to know that Jesus is always with us? How do you know that Jesus is still with us today?
