Fourth Sunday of Advent (Year C)

Gospel: Luke 1:39-45

In this Sunday's gospel, While Mary is pregnant with Jesus, she goes to visit her cousin Elizabeth who is also expecting a baby. As soon as Elizabeth sees Mary she is filled with joy. Why do you think this is?

Elizabeth is filled with the Holy Spirit and recognises that Mary's baby will be the Son of God. How do you think Mary feels when Elizabeth says this to her?



Do you have a baby brother or sister? Do you remember when your mum or dad told you that there would be a new baby in the family? How did it make you feel? How did you feel when they were born?

Babies are special. They need a lot of looking after. Can you think of some things that babies need?

Are there some things that you can do for yourself that a baby can't?

No matter where in the world that they are born, all babies need the same things. They need someone to love and care for them. They need someone to feed them and to keep them warm and clean.

Sometimes it is difficult for families to provide all of these things because of where they live or what is going on around them.

Our Catholic Mission:

God loves us all, even the tiniest baby.

As we remember how Mary and Elizabeth were filled with joy as they waited for their very special babies to arrive, let's think about all the other babies around the world and how special they are too.
