
<u>Virtues and Values for this Half Term - 'Intentional and Prophetic':</u>

Every half term as a school, we reflect on Values and Virtues to enable our pupils to live and learn for the greater glory of God and the common good. This half term, the values and Virtues which will be reflecting on in school are: 'Intentional and Prophetic'.

An **intentional** person is someone who lives deliberately; someone who builds up their own worldview and then tries to live by it. To live intentionally is to march to the beat of a different drummer.

Being **prophetic** is about being seen to do good and being prepared to speak out for what is right. Good news is only good news if it is announced. Jesus Christ was a person who lived **intentionally** and is a model of a good human life. His words, actions and example reflect his values. Trying to live in an **intentional** and **prophetic** way is what ultimately makes us human.

Please ask your child about their understanding of these virtues and how they are trying to follow these in their daily life.

Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)

Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

Jesus was watching people putting money in the collection box at the synagogue. He saw some rich people putting in lots of money. Then he saw a widow who was poor, putting in two small coins, the same as a penny.

What did Jesus say to the disciples about the woman?

Jesus said that she had put in more than all the other people together. The woman had only given two small coins and the others had given lots of money, so why did Jesus say she had given more?



The woman gave everything she had. While the people who had lots of money just gave a little bit of what they had left over.

Which do you think Jesus would like us to be like, the poor widow or the rich people? Why?

Jesus wants us to be generous and to share all that we have with others. Jesus asks us to give what we have to help others, as the widow does.

Jesus also shows us in this reading, that everyone has something that they can give, even if at first it does not look like they do.

We can give money, but we can also give other things too. Can you think what else we can give and share with others?

We can give our time – by listening to others, by being there for them when they are sad or worried – and we can give our talents. For example, you could sing a song, or paint a picture, or make someone laugh.

Our Catholic Mission:

What do you think the world would be like if everyone shared what they had?

What will you give to share with others in the coming week?

Prayer:

God of light,

we know that all people have something that they can give to share with others. Show us what we can give and help us to be generous as we share with others. Amen.
