
Dear Parents

KS2 entries are to be submitted to Mrs Kavanagh by Friday 13th December 2024.






Pray and Stay - Advent Family Prayer Services for Y4 and Y5 Parents:

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (Year B)

Gospel: John 18:33-37

In this Sunday's gospel Pilate asks Jesus if he is the king of the Jews. Jesus answers that his kingdom is not of this world. What do you think he means? Where is Jesus's kingdom?

Jesus doesn't wear a crown or have lots of riches. He doesn't live in a palace with lots of servants. What kind of king do you think Jesus is?

Jesus shows us that you do not have to be rich or powerful to be important. He shows us that what is more important is how you treat others. What we do and say is much more important than whether we are rich or poor or where we come from.



Pilate is confused. He couldn't understand what Jesus was saying. So he asks Jesus again if he is a king. Jesus replies that he was born to come into the world and share the truth with all people.

Pilate says, "Truth, what is that?" What do you think the truth that Jesus came to share is?

Jesus is the Son of God. He came to show us how to live. He came to teach us to help others, to love our neighbours and to share with them. And to pay more attention to what people do and say, than where they come from, or what they look like.

Jesus says that all those who are on the side of truth will listen to his voice.

Can you think of all the different people you listen to in a week? And what else do you listen to?

How do we listen to Jesus?

We can listen to Jesus by hearing the Gospels and thinking about what Jesus is showing us in them. Also we can listen to Jesus when we take time to be still and quiet and when we pray.

Our Catholic Mission:

This week let's try really hard to listen carefully to everyone. But most of all let's try really hard to listen to Jesus, a very different kind of king, in our lives.

How will you show you are listening to Jesus in your life this week?

Prayer:

Christ our King, help us to be like you, to listen to your truth and to see that all people are important, no matter who they are or where they come from. Amen.
