Fourth Sunday of Lent (Year C)

Gospel: Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

In this Sunday's gospel reading, Jesus tells us a story.

A man had two sons. What did the younger son do? He took his half of his father's money and went off and spent it all.

What job did the son do to try to earn some money after he had spent it all?



The son started to look after someone else's pigs. He was so hungry that he would have liked to eat the pigs' food, but no one would let him have it. How do you think he must have felt to know that no one was willing to share with him?

So the son set off home to see his father – to say sorry and to say that he would work as a servant in his house. How do you think the son was feeling?

How do you feel when you know you have done something wrong? Is it always easy to say sorry?

When he was a long way off, the father saw his son and rushed out to meet him, giving him a big hug. How do you think the father felt to see his son again after all this time?

How did the son expect his father to feel? But what did the father do after the son said sorry?

The father threw a big party! He was so happy that his son had returned to him, safe and sound. The father forgave his son for all that he had done and invited everyone to a big meal to celebrate.

The elder brother was not so pleased. Have you ever been cross with your brother or sister or a good friend? Why do you think the elder brother was angry that his father was throwing a party? But what did the father say?

God loves us all and forgives us for all the things that we have done wrong, just like the father in this story forgives his son.

God welcomes everyone to the feast. It doesn't matter who we are, where we come from or what we've done, we all have the right to share in the food that God has given for all people.

And we have to do our best to make sure that all people can get their fair share as well.

Our Catholic Mission:

Perhaps this week, we can do our best to say sorry for the times when we haven't done the right thing, especially when we haven't shared very well with others?

Let's also make a change, let's try to share more with others and work together so that all people are able to join in the feast of good food that God gives for us all.

Prayer:

God of life, you want all people to have enough to eat and to share with each other. Work through us so that this hope may become a reality.

Amen.
