
I hope that you and your families are all well.

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B)


Gospel: Mark 4:35-41

In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus is in a boat with his disciples, when the wind starts to blow really strongly. And the waves start crashing against the boat. They were so high that the boat almost sank.

Have you ever been on a boat when the weather was bad? What was it like? How do you think you would have felt if you were on this boat?

What was Jesus doing while all this was happening? Was he afraid?

What did Jesus do when the disciples woke him up?



If you had been one of the disciples on that boat, with the wind blowing and the waves crashing, do you think you would have trusted Jesus that everything would be ok?

Sometimes when everything around us is scary and going wrong, it can be hard to keep our faith in God. We can feel like God is no longer with us and it is hard to see how things will get better.

But in this reading Jesus tells the disciples not to be afraid. They should know that God is always with them, especially in the difficult times.

God works through us and through others who are there to help and support us in the difficult times.

Who makes you feel better when you are sad or frightened?

The next time that we are sad, or afraid, let us remember that we are never alone. God is always with us.

Our Catholic Mission:

Let's try to see God in those who make us laugh and be happy, or who help us when we are frightened – our friends, our family, our teachers...

And let's also try to be there for other people when they are facing difficult times, so that they know that God is still with them too.

Prayer:

God of courage, help us to be brave when things are difficult, and to be there for others who are facing hard times, so they may know that they are not alone. Amen.
